Evolution of the report title!

► **History:** Silk 2011, Thomas 2019, Delivering Justice in Wales 2022, Commission on Constitutional Affairs 2024, Gordon Brown's report.

Previous Reports: Criminal Justice rather than Police specific

Policing Currently

- ▶ **UK:** There are 48 police forces in the United Kingdom 170,775 officers
 - ▶ 43 territorial police forces in England and Wales.
 - National police force in Scotland and Northern Ireland and three specialist police forces namely the British Transport Police, the Civil Nuclear Constabulary, and the Ministry of Defence Police.
- ▶ Wales: Policing is not devolved but working in devolved environment. Welsh law specifically; Pandemic, Lawful chastisement, 20MPH, 8000 officers in Wales
- Policing is complex: local, regional, national approach and International reach. Interoperability, mutual aid, contracting and significant focus.

The Review

How Review Developed!

Terms of Reference

- The challenges and risks of a devolved model of policing for Wales.
- The practical, financial, and operational considerations associated with implementing policing devolution in Wales.
- The opportunities presented by devolving policing to Wales for communities.
- Consider future policing models for Wales.

Out of Scope:

We did not look at Governance, Wales Force Structure or make Recommendations.

Our Approach

- This is not an academic paper but academia was key.
- Interviews: Planned on 30 but conducted nearly 40.
- Questionnaires: learning taken from these.
- Experience of core team and stakeholder group.
- Outline how policing operates in Wales and across UK.

Development of report

- Clear from start that we offered anonymity.
- Role of WG research team was crucial.
- Looked to triangulate views and create a consensus.
- Whilst there were outliers most people were in a similar place, for example, around principle of devolution.
- Identified both broad themes and specific areas, for example, role of college of policing.
- Principle Versus Practicality of devolution!

Key Findings

Opportunities:

- The opportunity to align policing with other partners and formalise partnership arrangements in Wales.
- The ability to align policing more effectively within the broader public service approach in Wales. One Public Service.
- The opportunity to reimagine culture, and ethos for policing in Wales.
- An opportunity to define a vision for Welsh Policing.

Key Findings

- Challenges:
- Finance the complexity of current finance arrangements, potential risks going forward.
- Resourcing to support both the transition and future police operating model.
- National infrastructure and interoperability, both in relation to supporting (e.g. HMICFRS) and operational functions (e.g. NCA).
- Governance and accountability, approach and structure of Welsh Government, local accountability.
- Powers and legislation, historic legislation and future legislation.

Mitigation examples

- Funding formula review.
- Understanding core responsibilities/roles in Home Office.
- Building capacity and skills.
- Clarity of vision to design models
- Tabletop interoperability
- Lines of working
- Specify governance arrangements
- Understand legal framework and legislation development
- Clarity on required legislation changes

Potential Devolution Models

- Starting point has to be Welsh Governments aspiration:
- What functions they want to devolve.
- What functions will UK government agree to devolve.
- What legislation needs to be considered
- Three models:
- Completely devolved model.
- Incremental devolved model.
- A hybrid model
